Fulford Academy is approximately a one hour drive to the national capital of Ottawa, 2 hours to Montreal, and 4 hours to Toronto.

It is one of Ontario's oldest European-Canadian communities and is named after the British General Sir Isaac Brock. Brockville has a population of just over 21,000+ people and is a peaceful and idyllic community for young people to learn and grow.

Fulford Academy's Strength is Our Differentiated Method of Instruction and Assessment

We provide choices so our students can personalize their learning activities; our teachers hold students accountable by making the curriculum expectations clear from the outset, and coach to ensure that each student meets these goals through the activities; we actively promote more complex thought processes through an integration of the disciplines, as applied to open ended questions and real-life problem solving and projects.

Fulford Academy learning is supported by the extensive use of technology which is an essential tool for learning in our programs. Google Classroom is used to facilitate communication and collaboration between students and between students and the teacher. We use network and online resources and tools to supplement the in-house textual and multimedia sources available to our students. An area in which technology is of great value in learning is for facilitating differentiated instruction in our project-based learning and varied language proficiency classrooms. An interactive digital whiteboard is available in each classroom for lessons, student projects and presentations as well as new overhead cameras in the classroom to help support our online learners.



Fulford Academy Programs

Fulford Academy offers in-class programs for grades 6 to 12, for national and international boarding students and local-area day students. We also offer online courses for grades 6 to 12 students in Canada, and all over the world.

Middle School Grades 6-8

Middle school students in Grade 6, 7 and 8 at Fulford Academy study the full Ontario curriculum, with the integration of technologies such as computer coding and robotics. Cross-curricular integration in project work is the norm, and collaborative team teaching facilitates substantive student achievements

Students in this program spend much of the day with a dedicated grade teacher who creates a more consistent and sensitive learning environment. For ESL students, our ESL certified teachers provide support in a small classroom environment allowing students to improve their English skills while studying their academic courses

This is an ideal program for students who want more challenges in their education & an individualized approach to their learning. Courses include: Math, Science, Social Studies, French, Language Arts and Physical Education.

High School Grades 9-12

Fulford Academy's High School Program is for students who require individual attention in a small classroom environment to earn Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) credits towards their high school graduation. Our High School Program is an ideal program for students who succeed in a challenging academic environment. The Fulford Academy curriculum follows the guidelines set out by the Ministry of Education of Ontario. Students choose courses that are suited to their strengths, interests, and goals.


In order to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), a student must earn a minimum of 30 credits, including 18 compulsory credits and 12 optional credits. Students must also complete 40 hours of community involvement activities and must pass the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test, or successfully complete the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC4O).

Our high school students not only earn credits towards their OSSD, but they study in a technologically advanced, service-oriented, enriched program that prepares them for excellence in post-secondary studies.

Asynchronous Online Education

All of our programming is available in an asynchronous model, allowing flexibility and convenience to students and families. We offer office hour support and regularly scheduled individual meetings to ensure students are supported during their time with us!







Summer Programs

7 Week Summer Program

This popular 7-week program can be completed online or on campus* and is ideal for students ages 11-17 who are looking to improve their English language skills. Successful completion of this program will provide students with 1 credit (ESLAO) towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, whether they complete the program on campus, or online.

In the morning, students will be engaged in a variety of classroom activities based around the Ontario curriculum that will aid in developing English proficiency. Afternoons will consist primarily of fun, recreational activities including outings in the local and surrounding community

Extra-curricular programs and clubs will be available for students to experience and all activities will be subject to social distancing rules in place at that time. *COVID Restrictions may apply.

Our Dormitory

The Fulford Academy Residence is located off-campus, approximately 3 minutes by car, or a 10-minute walk. With a spectacular view of the St. Lawrence River, our three-level residence building boasts 28 dorm rooms that are divided into single, double, or triple room occupancy.

Each room is equipped with a bed, desk, dresser, and a coat rack. Fulford Academy supplies the linens for each student, however, if students wish to supply their own they are welcome to do so! Each room also has an individual AC/Heating unit.

We have dedicated staff members who take great care and pride in keeping our dorm facility clean and sanitized. Students are offered laundry services on a weekly basis. They are provided a specific day of the week that they are to gather their laundry and provide it to our laundry service department. The common rooms and washrooms are cleaned and sanitized on a daily basis, and each individual room is done on a weekly basis by our staff.

With a kitchenette on the 1st and 3rd level, students have the option of keeping their own food in their individual rooms and using the kitchenette for preparation. Some of the most popular uses of the kitchenette include preparing microwavable meals, cold food storage, and

Houses


Fulford Academy prides itself on our inclusive family atmosphere and part of the way we achieve this is through our House System & our Advisor Program. Upon arrival at Fulford Academy, each student is placed into one of our Houses where they will work as a team in various challenges. Through activities, spirit days, and challenges during the year, Houses will come together to actively participate and work together with the intention of fostering teamwork and leadership skills.

Advisor Program

Each student at Fulford Academy is assigned a staff advisor. Advisors meet with their students weekly to discuss academic, social, and co-curricular progress with students. If the advisor feels it necessary, they can communicate with families to discuss concerns or achievements with families. At all reporting periods, Heads of House will include an anecdotal comment from the advisor for the family of their student. Comments will often outline success, challenges, and any strategies they are putting in place with the student for improvement.

Community Involvement

Fulford works in cooperation with several different institutions in Brockville to provide volunteer opportunities for boarding students. Volunteering is a great way for Fulford students to give back to the community and engage with locals to get a true Canadian cultural experience.







Guidance

Since our goal is to place students in the university chosen by the student and their family, we offer an extensive guidance and placement service. We draw upon our strong ties with the universities and Colleges across Canada and the USA and we have extensive resources within Fulford Academy to ensure that families are making the right choice based upon the student's skills and interests.

We take the time to get to know not only the student's academic abilities, but also their interest and ability in sports, arts, music, leadership and their career aspirations. Each university has different areas of excellence and we guide students to the institutions that will best nurture their personal talents.

The Academy provides appropriate services and support to help students make informed, realistic academic and career choices. Several times a year, students review and revise their academic plans, and all students have weekly opportunities for input and direction from their faculty Advisors.

Athletics

Due to COVID-19, competitive teams are not allowed to compete against other schools. However, Fulford Academy has adapted and has created a number of sports clubs that are entirely in-house and only for our Fulford Academy students. These clubs currently include badminton, basketball, volleyball, cross country, etc.

Prefects
